At the end of November we discussed the Government's green paper "Fulfilling Our Potential: Teaching Excellence, Social Mobility and Student Choice". There was a large turnout for the meeting to hear from Jo Johnson MP, Iain Wright MP and Dr Steven Jones. If you've not yet had a chance to read them, the presentations by Jo Johnson MP and Dr Steven Jones are available on our website, along with the note from the meeting and an interesting blog by Steve Jones. The second of

our recent meetings was to discuss sexual harassment and 'lad culture' in the sector. We had four excellent presentations from Laura Bates, Susuana Amoah, Professor David Richardson and Nicola Dandridge.
